But is that the mentality a member needs? I understand that some of you have been President or any other office for years and need a small break, but that break shouldn't last forever. We are probably all in agreement that when one person is in the same office for years and years they get stationary and just go through the motions. New ideas are not formed or acted upon. We need to revitalize the officers, maybe you step down from Secretary to Chaplain or even Guard. So many auxiliaries are struggling to get officers or even have enough members in attendance to hold a quorum. Maybe the solution to getting a bigger attendance at a meeting is as simple as changing the date and time. Use social media or other platforms to reach out to all members to attend a "special" meeting, which could be a holiday-related meeting at this time of year. Consider having a potluck meeting in November or December and or/ bringing items for charity.

Unfortunately, another reason is personality conflicts, whether between the Post members or between auxiliary members. Remember the Auxiliary is a GUEST of the VFW Post and should act as such. I have had a few instances regarding the inability to get along and my conclusion is as follows: The Auxiliary wants to HELP and DO and in doing so they may overstep their role in relation to the Post. The Post may feel like they are being overrun with the auxiliary. Our National leaders this year encourage working together. To work together, communication is key! If the officers from both sides are not talking to each other that is when "things go downhill fast." I am not speaking of "permission" for an activity, etc, but this is what we are planning, and are open to suggestions kind of talk or asking the Post exactly what specific things they would like the auxiliary to do. Another strong suggestion, you don't have to like or be best friends with everyone, but respect the person, the office, and the organization and get along while performing VFW Auxiliary functions.

You may not know this! When you sign up a new member or transferring one from annual to life, know this: In the calendar year this is happening in, whatever age they are on December 31st of that calendar year is the age you use in determining the amount due. For example, Merry Member will be 46 years old on December 7, 2025. Merry is an annual member and wants to convert to life, but thought she had to wait until after her birthday to do so to get the cheaper rate. NO! Merry is eligible to convert to life from January 1, 2025 till December 31, 2025. Whatever age you are on December 31st of that year is the age-related amount of dues owed. Is your Auxiliary on track to achieve the Circle of Excellence? It can be viewed by all members logged onto the new website, pull it up and see where your Auxiliary is at currently. Membership, which is the biggest point amount, is added as it is achieved. I

would be so proud to have every auxiliary in the Circle of Excellence!

I want to say thank you for everything you do as a member of the Auxiliary. I appreciate

your hard work in doing what we do for our Veterans and their families.

MEMBERSHIP APPLICATIONS

It is the Auxiliary's responsibility to make sure that the application is completed in full. The most common errors that I see are the following: o Recruiter's name and/or Recruiter Membership IDs are missing o Date of Birth Missing o For Post-Affiliated Veterans, the VFW Membership ID is required o For Non-Affiliated Veterans, the campaign ribbons and/.or medals must be on the application. You only need to put the qualifying medals on the application. It is not necessary to show medals such as Good Conduct, World War II Victory Medal, Sharp Shooter's Badge. Please refer to Section 101-Eligibility.

AUDITS

o The Trustees should conduct audits. The President, Secretary and the Treasurer should attend the audit.

o The Trustees will need the Treasurer and Secretary's Books at the audit o They will also need the Bills, Vouchers, Bank Statements including the cancelled check or copies of the checks (Please refer to Page 23 in the yellow pages of the Bylaws for a complete list) o The current audit being conducted will begin with the ending balances from the prior audit o A check of the receipts and expenditures is completed and recorded on the audit form. All checks written during the quarter should be included and should be listed in the Treasurer's monthly report regardless if it has cleared o The ending balance on the audit should be matched with the last treasurer's report for the quarter, the Check Register and the reconciled bank statement. o Please avoid taking a photo and texting the audit. It is very hard to get clear copy this way. It is best to scan or fax the report.

990N

o Your 990N, should be entered no later than November 15, 2024. The

Treasurer's Resources on MALTA has training on how to set up your IRS

account and complete your 990N. This is FREE through IRS.gov.

o New this year: Send a copy of your acceptance receipt to me once you

have completed it.

From Secretary Rhonda Borkgren:

I can't believe how fast this year has gone, already November 1st. I know I have been busy, and I am sure all of you have too. Did you get to watch the live from National the other day? It is always interesting to see what they have to say. I agree, if one person is asking the question, probably many, want the answer too. The new Bylaws books are not out in print yet, but they are on MALTA. It is the green cover book. You can go to it and look something up hit Control F. Then type in your question or what you want to find. How you put your word will depend on what you get for answers. So, you might have to try different words.

One of the things they discussed was District dues. Just because National said you can go up to an amount for District dues doesn't mean you have to raise them. The only time you can raise them is when you vote on them during your District Convention, which is usually held in April or May. Remember only delegates can vote. Section 506-A

Auxiliaries can vote to use Pay Pal, Zel, Venmo, to collect payments for fundraisers. This was approved at National Convention. It is section 813 A-7. It needs to be discussed and voted on at a meeting before you can use it.

Auxiliaries can also use mobile deposit, but they must keep the record (either the check or a photo of it for 6 years), Trustees have one of the most important jobs in the Auxiliary. They are supposed to be going through all the records and making sure all money spent have been voted on and approved. If there is a problem, the Trustees are ultimately responsible. Don't just sign your name without being sure the books are accurate.

If something happens to the treasurer, they go away for the winter, or are sick, you can have someone temporarily take their place. Appoint an acting treasurer to take their place. It needs the approval of the Department President. You will need to let us know for how long, if temporary or if it's until the next election. The Secretary will enter it into Malta. Please be sure to contact me or Cindy if this happens.

At this time only members can enter their informal join date. National is going to allow Secretaries and Treasurers to do this, but not sure when it will be started. For now members can enter the date they joined and the Secretary and Treasurer can print that list. This is so we can get that information for awarding year pins.

If you need help or have questions, we are only a phone call away. We are here to help. If you think you should have points for something in the Circle of Excellence and it isn't on there, please give me a call or send me an email and I will help you out. Linda and I try to make sure everything is accurate, but we can miss one sometimes.

November isn't just about Veterans Day on the 11th or Thanksgiving on the 28th; it's National Veterans and Military Families Month. This month is dedicated to recognizing the sacrifices and contributions of veterans, military members, and their families to the U.S. Armed Forces. It is also the perfect time to highlight the VFW's National Veterans Service (NVS) Program.

NVS helps veterans, service members, and their families obtain the benefits they

deserve at no cost. The program funds a network of VFW Service Officers who assist with navigating the VA system. These VFWaccredited officers recover over \$1 billion annually in VA benefits and help with filing claims for all veterans, whether they are VFW members or not.



Elections and Political Activities

VFW Auxiliary members are encouraged to get involved in Congressional and FOR UNCOMMON HEROES• Presidential elections, hold voter registration drives, town hall meetings and other events featuring candidates for public office. We view it as a positive and it shows veterans and those who support veterans issues to be a strong group of voters that most candidates want on their side. As we approach the Congressional and Presidential campaign season, here are a few items to keep mind as you get involved and attend and/or host candidate functions and town hall meetings:

DO's

Do attend candidate town hall Meetings and other events and ask candidates where they stand on veterans issues. Do set up voter registration drives/Get Out the Vote Campaigns on the locai level. Do provide carpool service on Election Day to help the elderly and disabled get to the voting booth. Do support and work for your favorite candidates as a voting constituent. Do wear ciothing/pins with the VFW Auxiliary emblem at public events such as town halls, rallies, forums and/or debates. DON'TS

- Don't endorse candidates on behalf of the VFW Auxiliary National Organization, Department, District or Auxiliary.
- Don't wear your VFW Auxiliary cap when actively campaigning fora candidate, such as soliciting donations or knocking on doors asking people to pledge their vote for a candidate.

It does not matter which candidate(s) you support as long as they know you are a VFW Auxiliary member and concerned about veterans, our military personnel and their families. The key is to stay informed on the issues and use your influence to urge new candidates and those up for reelection to support the VFW, VFW Auxiliary and veterans' issues.VFW Auxiliary members can make a difference in any election by getting involved in the political process.

It's that time of the year when leaves and temperatures fall BUT one thing we cannot let fall is membership! Our first National Goal is November 30th to reach 95%! As a department, as of October 14, we need to collect 933 dues to reach 95%! We need to go big this month by collecting dues from our unpaid members. Now is the time to make those personal contacts by phone or in person. Remind them why they joined, the benefits of being a member, including cancer grants, and how important our mission is to Veterans. Members can pay dues on MALTA or send a check to the Auxiliary Treasurer.

As a reminder, December 31st is the last day you can pay dues and stay in good standing. Good standing means you can apply for a cancer grant, attend meetings, and be an officer. After that day, you are no longer an active member. Our year runs July 1st to June 30 and that is how our dues year

runs. Members are given time to get their dues paid before they are no longer considered a member and need to show eligibility again.

With the holidays approaching, money will be tight. December meetings have a chance of being cancelled due to weather issues so do not rely on your December meeting to collect or pay dues. Try to get all dues paid in November, not only to reach our goals but to avoid any issues that might come up in December.

And talking about the holidays—let's talk about recruiting during the holidays.

-School or city craft fairs are the perfect place to set up a table to give out information.

-Check your VFW membership list with eligible members that are not already members.

Challenge your VFW members to bring in new members. Maybe offer a gift card as a prize to the VFW member who brings in the most eligible family members.

-Does your town host a holiday lights or holiday event. Pair up with your town to get your contact information out there.

-Offer a Christmas or holiday "special" that if you join during December, your Auxiliary dues are on the Auxiliary for the first year!

-And of course—YOU can give the gift of membership to those who qualify so that they can give back to their families who have given us so much!

Mary Lee and I wish you all Happy Holidays and we look forward to helping your Auxiliary to not only maintain but also add new members in the holidays!

VOD and Patriot's Pen

If you need a copy of the scoring sheets for these essays, please contact your District Auxiliary Chairman. I gave them copies of everything needed for judging. Try to have an award program for your winners. Include your judges, teachers and Post and Auxiliary members. Show the students how important it was for your Post to get their participation in these contests.

Continuing Education Scholarship

Please get copies of this application to your members as soon as possible if you have not done so yet. This is limited to only auxiliary members (who have been a member for at least one year), spouses, sons or daughters. The applicant must be at least 21 years old. There is an essay required with this application and it is due to National by February 15, 2025. Please DO NOT send these to me. Please remember National has an escrow fund for Continuing Education that you can donate to, so the amount of the award can continue to increase. It is now \$1,250 for one winner from each of the 4 conferences. Donations are to be sent directly to National Auxiliary in Kansas City and earmarked for Continuing Education. Donations can also be done in Malta.

Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest

Please remember students can enter the 2-D and 3-D contest. Every Auxiliary can send me a 2-D and 3-D winner. I need to build an extra room to hold all of them. Please see the applications for all details for each type of art. These applications need to be at the high schools as soon as possible so students can start thinking about what they want to do and start working on their entry. Copies of the applications are on the vfwauxil.org website along with a press release and judging sheet. I also gave this information to your District Auxiliary Chairman.
