Treasurer's Ramblings

Treasurer's Points

Delegates for the Department Convention in June 2025 will be elected at your April Meeting. Prior to your meeting, you will receive an email with the number of delegates and alternates for your auxiliary that will need to be elected. The email will also contain the President and Delegate fee that you will need to send to the Department Treasurer. There will be no invoices mailed as has been done in the past.

Just a reminder: the delegate fee was increased to \$10.00 at the convention held in June 2024. Whether your auxiliary plans to attend convention or not, this fee is due to the Department by May 15, 2025. This money is used to help pay for the Convention expenses. If not paid, your auxiliary will be considered in arrears.

Remember your audits **MUST** be current for your auxiliary to vote at the District, Department and National Convention.

REMINDERS:

- ☐ Auxiliary and District audits should be sent/emailed/faxed to the Department Treasurer. Please refer to your roster for the correct information.
- o The second quarter Auxiliary audit was due by July 31st
- o Your third quarter audit was due by October 31st
- o Your Fourth Quarter audit was due by January 31st
- o Your next audit for January 1 thru March 31, 2025 is due by April 30th
- o All audits must be received and verified prior to Department Convention or the Auxiliary/District will not be allowed to cast their vote. Also, National will be notified and you will not be able to vote at the National Convention in July.

If you need any help or have any questions, please feel free to contact me. I am here to help you.

From Secretary Rhonda Borkgren:

I can't believe how fast this year is flying by. Here we are having an election of officers already. I hope to see many new faces! I want to go over the information needed at your next Auxiliary meeting. First you need to do nomination and election of officers during new business. Just follow the Ritual book on page 42. It tells you exactly what to do. You will also need to elect delegates to the District, Department, and National Convention. For District you elect 1 Delegate for every 15 members or fraction thereof. For Department you elect 1 Delegate for every 30 members or fraction thereof. National Delegates are 1 for every 35 members or fraction thereof. A delegate is elected for a period of one year. Try to choose Delegates who will be attending Conventions. If you have a commander's wife who never attends auxiliary meetings, but you know she goes to Department and National Conventions with her husband, make her a delegate. When she registers, your auxiliary will have a vote. It helps the Department and your Auxiliary.

Once you are finished with election the SECRETARY should go into MALTA and under Installation Reports enter the information of who was elected. By doing it as soon as you are finished with election, you ensure your auxiliary will get the maximum number of points on the Circle of Excellence for next year! You will also need to send your Delegate form to Linda along with your delegate fees. While you are in MALTA, enter your Auxiliary Delegates for National Convention. They can only be entered by the Secretary, and they must be entered in MALTA. You can't snail mail them. If you have any problems, please call me at 309-714-8077 and I will walk you through it.

Your packet will be emailed to both the Secretary and President. One of you will need to print off the forms and take them to your April meeting.

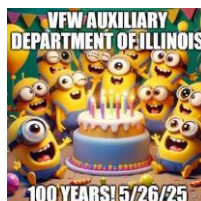

As Watters Flight 2025 is collecting boarding passes for Department Convention in Columbus, OH in August, we must continue Navigating the Future to reach 101%+ in membership by June 30, 2025.

Annual dues must be received at VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters by June 30, 2025, for the member to maintain his or her continuous years of membership within the organization.

And don't stop recruiting new passengers (members) for our flight! Be sure every area of the application is completed. It is important to include who recruited the new member (your name and membership number) to receive credit towards recruiting awards. Be sure the member's name, address, phone, email and date of birth are included. Phone and email address are vital when it comes to contacting the member.

For the application, how do you determine whether to check "post affiliated" or "non-affiliated". If the Veteran they are joining under is a member of the post they are joining, then they are POST affiliated and just need his or her name, membership number and relationship to them. Non-affiliated means your Veteran is not a member of the post you are joining or is deceased. You need to include the relationship, name of Veteran, Post number if a member, name of campaign ribbons or medals, dates and location of service. A credit card or ACH can only be used for a life membership. Be sure the application is signed and dated.

Thank you for all the work you have done to maintain and grow our membership in this great organization. We look forward to a full flight with a waiting list on Watters Flight 2025!

YOUNG AMERICAN CREATIVE PATRIOTIC ART - 2-D

All the information for this contest should be at the schools. It is due to your Auxiliary by March 31st. This is for any High School student in grades 9-12, except for foreign exchange students, previous National winners in the Patriotic Art contest, students age 20 or older, GED and adult education students.

This must be on canvas or paper. The students can use watercolor, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempers, crayon, acrylic, pen, ink, oil, marker or any other media.

DO NOT frame this art. Submit canvas entries on a stretcher frame or canvas board. If matted, it must be matted in white. DO NOT use color mats. Reinforce the back with heavy paper.

Mounted and floating mats may also be used.

The art should not be smaller than 8" x 10" and no larger than 18" x 24", not including the mat.

3-D YOUNG AMERICAN CREATIVE PATRIOTIC ART

Entries for this contest can be paper, paper-mache, pottery, sculpture, fabric, wood, metalwork, etc.

Entries cannot be larger than 18" in any direction and cannot weight more than 5 pounds.

Jewelry, digital art and photography are not accepted.

A student can enter both the 2-D and 3-D contests.

There is no District judging in Illinois for either contest. Send your 1st place winners to me by April 15, 2025. Every Auxiliary can send me a 1st place winner in each category.

Remember to please send these to me by UPS or Fed Ex. Last year the USPS did not get me an art picture until May 15th even though it stated it needed to be delivered by April 15th. I want every student that enters the contest and is your 1st place winner to be judged at the Department level.

***Make sure the application is completed and signed by the student and a parent or guardian. Your Auxiliary name, number, Department, and signature by your Scholarship chairman should also be completed on the application before sending it to me. ***

Please recognize your winners by giving them an award at an award ceremony and recognize the parents and teachers. Also, put pictures in the newspaper or Facebook of your winners. If your Auxiliary is able, please make a donation to the Illinois Patriotic Art Fund sent to our Department Treasurer and/or the National Patriotic Art Escrow Fund on MALTA, so the award amounts can be increased.
